Laura welcomed everyone - seasoned and new members. Laura explained what she does for the city of Newport. Open meeting law was explained. Playground Project - Project pending upon environmental studies

EPA, DEC, RPC, NCIC are all involved. City has had possession of land for 100 years. It was once a landfill. 1982 was the year the playground was put in originally. There have been findings of contaminants that exceed today's standards. We need a corrective action plan (CAP). We believe we need the CAP for the playground and splash pad. The bulk of the fill was mostly where the playground is now. The CAP is a possibility of an 18 inch scraping and 18 of new soil. What do we do with the contaminated soil? Options - depends on how contaminated the soil is. We can only do a press release with the EPA and DEC. Casella is a strong supporter of this project. They will help us with whatever they can help us with. Alternative Daily Cover or if it is landfilled Casella will help us. If it goes out of state it will cost more. Grants are available. Because we are the responsibility party the city itself is not eligible for the grants. It has to be a 501c3, experienced with accountability paperwork. Where the park is, is in a very accessible area. It needs to stay usable for everyone.

Can we move the playground to another location within the park?

Ballpark maintenance - will be different this year. Other users would like to be heard and we can move forward with the help of the Rec. Committee.
